Feast of St. Joseph the Worker

Tuesday, May 01, 2018

St. Joseph has two feast days on the liturgical calendar. The first is March 19—Joseph, the Husband of Mary. The second is May 1—Joseph, the Worker. “Saint Joseph is a man of great spirit. He is great in faith, not because he speaks his own words, but above all because he listens to the words of the Living God. Joseph understood the importance of work. He was a carpenter a builder and probably taught Jesus his trade. Through his work, Joseph honored the Father in heaven and continued the act of creation. He lived in dignity. To give workers a patron, the Church turned to Joseph, who had been made the Patron of the Universal Church by Pope Pius IX in 1870 and the model for fathers of families. Joseph was named protector of workers by Pope Benedict XV, and in 1955, the feast of Saint Joseph the Worker on May 1 was proclaimed by Pius the XII. Let us pray to Saint Joseph for his help in all our work and for those many people who want and need jobs but cannot find them.

**The Gospel According to Mark;
Truth and Life. Dramatized Audio Bible**

Often considered to be St. Peter’s account of the life of Christ as told to St. Mark, this gospel is action-packed and emphasizes discipleship. St. Mark stresses the struggle of taking up one’s cross every day and following Jesus by including details about the fleeing disciple in the Garden of Gethsemane, St. Peter’s discipleship at a distance on Good Friday, and even the fear and hesitation of the women on Easter Sunday morning. Nearly every story begins with the phrase “and then...” drawing the readers through the adventure of discipleship. Engaging and compelling, St. Mark’s Gospel is the story of true discipleship and life in Christ.
