While Holy Thursday focuses our attention on the institution of the Eucharist and its relationship to the Passion, today's celebration, The Feast of Corpus Christi — the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, **focuses on the**

Eucharist itself. As the Catechism says, **“The Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life.** The other sacraments, and indeed all ecclesiastical ministries and works of the apostolate, are bound up with the Eucharist and are oriented toward it. **For in the blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ himself...**” (CCC 1324).

Celebrating the Saints: St. John the Baptist

When we celebrate a saint's feast day, we celebrate their birth into heaven. In the liturgical calendar, there are only three actual birthdays celebrated: Christmas—the birth of Jesus, September 8—the birth of Mary, and **June 24, the birth of St. John the Baptist.** Mary and St. John the Baptist are the only two human beings born without original sin. Mary was conceived without original sin, and John the Baptist was sanctified in this mother's womb — he was "filled with the Holy Spirit even from his mother's womb" (Lk 1,:15) and so though he was conceived with original sin, he was born cleansed of it before birth. His life then was lived in witness of the coming of Christ. **We are called to be like St. John the Baptist in our living lives of witness to Jesus and in testifying to our faith. On his feast day, let us reflect on our witness.** Do I speak of my faith? Of what Christ has done in my life? Does my life give testimony of my faith how I live—can people see something different in me? Does my life glorify God or myself? How can I improve my witness?

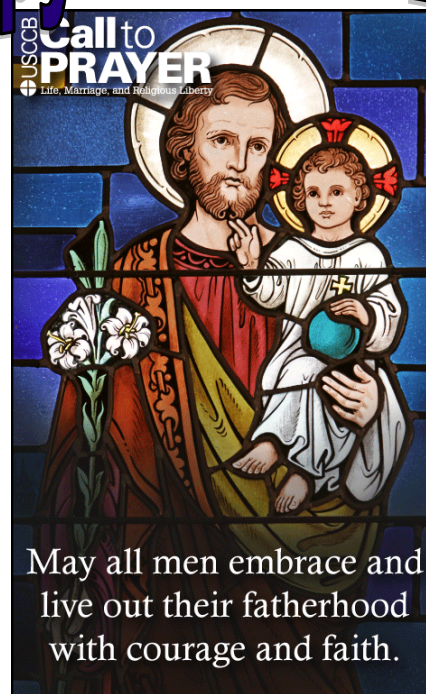
