Celebrating the Saints:

Solemnity of Sts. Peter and Paul, Apostles



June 29, we celebrate the **Solemnity of Sts. Peter and Paul.** “Together, the two saints are the founders of the See of Rome, through their preaching, ministry, and martyrdom there.” (Catholic News Agency) St. Peter is the rock upon whom Christ built his Church, despite his human weakness. After Christ’s death, resurrection, and ascension, **St. Peter lead the early Church as the first Pope** until his own crucifixion in Rome.

He asked to be **crucified upside-down**, saying he was unworthy to die as Jesus did. St. Peter’s Basilica is built over the site where he was buried.

.. Paul is recognized as the apostle to the Gentiles., though he did not meet Jesus before his crucifixion. He says of himself, “For I am the least of the apostles, who am not fit to be called an apostle because I persecuted the church of God.” (1 Cor 15:9) His missionary and pastoral travels are outline in the Acts of the Apostles, and he has traditionally been credit with having written 14 of the 21 letters of the New Testament, though some were actually written by disciples of Paul. Those letters written by Paul were written earlier than any of the Gospels. St. Paul was **beheaded** and is buried in the Church of St. Paul outside the Walls.

Pope Benedict XVI said, “**The Feast of the Holy Apostles Peter and Paul...is first and foremost a feast of catholicity,**” and points to their travels to Rome as “**...the expression of the universal outreach of the Gospel.**” (Homily, June 29, 2015). On this feast day, take a minute to **give thanks for the gift of the Church!**
