Knowing the Saints: St. Matthew, Apostle

St. Matthew's feast day is September 21. Apostle and evangelist, St. Matthew provides a great witness to the **possibility** Christ gives to **each person to change his or her life.** When Jesus called him, St. Matthew was a Jew, working as a tax collector for the Romans. As such he was considered to be getting wealthy off his own people. As such, he was shunned. When Jesus called him, he left everything to follow the Lord. Wanting others to have the opportunity to meet Jesus, St. Matthew hosted a banquet to introduce his fellow tax collectors to him. The Pharisees complained about Jesus eating with sinners, and Jesus responded, "I have not come to call the righteous but sinners..." (Lk 5:32). We can ask ourselves whether we follow Jesus immediately when he asks something of us. We can also ask whether there are things that we cling to though we may need to leave them behind to follow Jesus. Finally, what do we do to introduce others to Jesus? Do we make a concrete effort to help our friends encounter him?

Every Christian is challenged, here and now, to be actively engaged in evangelization; indeed, anyone who has truly experienced God's saving love does not need much time or lengthy training to go out and proclaim that love. Every Christian is a missionary to the extent that he or she has encountered the love of God in Christ Jesus... (Pope Francis, *Evangelii Gaudium*, no. 120)
