2017-2018 Ministry Year!

We were excited to get started with youth programs for the 2017-18 ministry year last week. **The mission** for our youth programs is: To facilitate transformative family-based programs focusing on dispositions that nurture authentic Christ-centered lives. **Each week we will start out in the church** with all youth 1st-12th grade and their families in order to pray together, talk about the lives of Saints, and consider how we can live our Catholic faith in our day to day lives. **Afterward**, while youth are in their individual classes, we encourage parents to utilize the time to nurture their own faith formation by praying (either alone or with a group of other parents), reading the Bible, reading a Catholic book/magazine, or watching a Formed resource. **At the end of each session** the whole group gathers together again for closure and prayer.
