Rejoice and Be Glad!

You may have seen a headline that the Holy Father has written a new apostolic exhortation, and you may have wondered what does that mean? First, it is a document issued directly by the pope in his own name. It may be issued after a Synod of Bishops to summarize the conclusions or it may be issued as encouragement on a particular issue. It does not have the same weight as an encyclical, but it still calls for the respect of the faithful.

apostolic exhortation is:

"Gaudete et Exsultate"- "Rejoice and Be Glad: On the Call to Holiness in Today's World". In this exhortation, Pope Francis tells us: "The Lord asks everything of us, and in return he offers us true life, the happiness for which we were created. He wants us to be saints and not to settle for a bland and mediocre existence." He then shows us how we all-whatever our state in life-can live a life of holiness, and why we would want to do so. He challenges us to join the baptized in that "great cloud of witnesses" that includes our own mothers, grandmothers and loved ones. And he calls on us to do so in the concrete circumstances of our own lives, with our own gifts and talents. The Holy Father recognizes that this is not always easy but that it is worth the battle. The Pope writes: "The Christian life is a constant battle. We need strength and courage to withstand the temptations of the devil and to proclaim the Gospel. The battle is

sweet, for it allows us to rejoice

each time the Lord triumphs in

our lives".
