

Get FORMED for Youth



Listen to the life of Francis Bernadone, a wealthy young Italian teen who became better known as St. Francis of Assisi. Follow his story of conversion and decision to be "all in" for God!

Or watch the movie of his life. In the age knights and kings, when honor belonged to the heroes and glory was found in the bat-



tle field, Francis, wished to become a mighty warrior and conquer a magnificent castle. One day Francis felt a calling to greater glory. God had vested upon him a very special mission that would require a supreme act of courage. For the love of God, his King, Francis gave up everything that he had and joyfully embarked on an exciting and unexpected adventure. Francis: The Knight of Assisi is the remarkable story of the founder of the Order of Minor Friars and inspiration of three Franciscan orders.

Knowing the Saints: St Francis of Assis St. Francis grew up in a wealthy family in a permissive culture, but at age 25, he experienced a deep **conversion,** and he began to examine and change his life. He came to love nature and peace, simplicity and poverty, and the Church. His life began to attract others, and he began a religious community of men, and later, with St. Clare, a community for women. On his **feast day, October 4,** we can reflect on his words: "Sanctify yourself and you will sanctify societu." Ask yourself, "Amm I striving to do what God calls me to? Am I conformed to God's will or to the world? Are there ways in which I could simplify my life to make more time for God? What or who is most important in my life? If it seems impossible to change, remember another quote, "Start by doing what's necessary; then do what's possible; and suddenly you are doing the impossible."
