Virgen de Guadalupe

Each evening we will gather in the houses of different families to pray the Rosary in Spanish, meditating on Our Lady's apparitions to St. Juan Diego in Mexico. The start time varies: 5 pm or 6 pm. The final Rosary will be on Tuesday, December 12th, during the mañanitas. On December 12th, we will have mañanitas in the church at 6 am followed by a breakfast in the parish hall. At 6 pm that night there will be Mass in Spanish followed by a buffet style dinner. Immaculate Conception!

December 8th is a big day. It is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception and a holy day of obligation. On this day, we celebrate God's preparation of Mary to be the mother of Jesus. He did this by preserving her from original sin. Sometimes Protestants will comment that this would mean that Mary didn't need a savior. That is not what the Church teaches. Rather we understand that since Jesus is eternal, one with the Father, he saved his own mother before his life on earth! Preserving her from original sin makes sense in that it was into her body that God himself would come. Some have used the analogy of the Precious Blood. As we use a special vessel, a chalice, to hold the Precious Blood of Our Lord, Mary is the vessel of life for Jesus and as such it makes sense that she be preserved without stain of original sin in preparation for this day.

This feast day has a special significance to us. Not only is Our Lady under the title of "The Immaculate Conception" the patroness of the United States, she is patroness of Our Lady of the Valley. There will be a celebration with refreshments and family activities after the 7 pm Mass.

Neighbors Together Woodlot
