Do we need new carpet?

Some have wondered if we really need new carpet. Celebrating the Saints

In 1597, St. Paul Miki and companions were martyred in Nagasaki, Japan. Paul Miki was a Jesuit brother and is the best known of these martyrs. While on a cross, he said, "The only reason for my being killed is that I have taught the doctrine of Christ...I thank God it is for this reason I die." Missionaries were banned from Japan in the early 1600s, as was the practice of Christianity. Nevertheless, when missionaries returned to Japan in the 1860s, they found thousands of Christian living around Nagasaki who had secretly preserved the faith. Pope Francis said, "The 'hidden Christians' of Japan remind us that the work of fostering the life of the Church and of evangelizing require the full and active participation of the lay faithful. Their mission is twofold: to engage in the life of the parish and local Church, and to permeate the social order with their Christian witness."
