Chrism Mass

Mark your calendars for **Thursday**, **April 6th at 7 pm** for the annual **Chrism Mass**. In this Mass, the unity of the priests of the diocese with the bishop is manifest as they concelebrate the Mass and renew the vows they made at priestly ordination. Additionally, the bishop blesses the oils of catechumens, the oil of the infirm, and the holy chrism for sacramental use throughout diocese during the year. This Mass is celebrated **at St. Francis de Sales Cathedral in Baker**. There will be a **reception following** Mass. Parishioners are encouraged to attend, especially if you have never attended a Chrism Mass before. It is a powerful experience to see Bishop Cary celebrating Mass with all of the priests from across the diocese concelebrating.

What is Laetare Sunday?

The fourth Sunday of Lent is known as Laetare Sunday. As on Gaudete Sunday (the third Sunday of Advent), there is a break in the penitential season. The name comes from the opening of the Mass: Laetare Jerusalem — **Rejoice**, Jerusalem! This opening goes on to say, "Be joyful, all who were in mourning!" (From Isaiah 66). Rose vestments may be worn as a symbol of joy and hope, and flowers may adorn the altar. Why rejoice on this Sunday? Because we are looking forward with expectation to Easter. Anticipating the joy is meant to give us hope and encouragement as we continue our journey through Lent.
