And so is New Vinyl!

As you may have noticed, not **only did we install the carpet, we installed new vinyl under the pews. Originally, we had planned to delay this part of the project, but the experts recommended that it be done at the same time** as the carpet for the best installation, so we decided to go ahead with it at the same time. We did incur an expense of **\$7,000 above the original estimate, and that will be paid from the parish savings account. Celebrating the Saints

When you see a picture of St. Catherine of Siena, it may look as if she is a religious woman — a sister or a nun. In reality, she was a lay woman, though a third order member of the Dominican order. The *Magnificat* missalette points out that she was the first lay person to be recognized as a Doctor of the Church. A Doctor of the Church is known for the depth of her understanding of the faith and the orthodoxy of her theological teaching as well as the usefulness of her writings and teaching for Christians "in any age of the Church."
