You don't even know how to get to the post office and you are going to teach me how to go to Heaven?!

<u>Celebrating the Saints — Our Lady of Fatima</u> <u>100 Year Anniversary of Apparitions</u>

May 13th is the feast of Our Lady of Fatima, and this year is the 100th anniversary of these apparitions of Our Lady to three Portuguese children-Francisco and Jacinta Marto and their cousin Lucia dos Santos. In these appearances, Mary asked the children to pray the rosary for world peace, for the end of World War I, for sinners, and for the conversion of Russia. In an apparition on October 13, 1917, the sun is said to have danced and spun in the sky and is acknowledged as the "Miracle of the Sun." Newspaper articles of time estimated that as many as 100,000 people witnessed this miracle. Francisco and Jacinta are being canonized during the Pope's visit to Fatima this month. They will become the youngest children (other than martyrs) ever canonized - Jacinta died at age 9 and Francisco at age 10 of influenza. Lucia, who became a Carmelite nun, died in 2005 at the age of 9y; the cause for her beatification is underwav.

Mary gave the children three secrets. Following the deaths of Francisco and Jacinta, Lucia told the first two secrets which had to do hell, and prayer and penance to end World War I and to save the world from a second, larger war. Pope Saint John Paul II directed that the third secret be revealed in 2000; it spoke about the sufferings of the Church and of a "bishop in white" who was shot. Many people, including Pope Saint John Paul II himself, inked this vision to the assassination attempt against John Paul II in St. Peter's Square on May 13, 1981., and the Pope attributes his survival to the intercession of Our Lady of Fatima.
