To qualify for the 2018 general election, the measure must gather 117,000 signatures of registered Oregon voters in the next few months. 2017 Bishop's Annual Appeal



Celebrating the Saints: St. Isidore the Farmer

May 15 is the feast day of St. Isidore the Farmer. He is patron of farmers, laborers, and rural communities as well as the U.S. National Rural Life Conference. His wife, Maria, became a hermit after his death and was beatified. She is known as Maria de la Cabeza because her head (conserved in a reliquary and carried in procession) has often brought rain. Catholicrurallife.org, "St Isidore's life is a model of simple Christian charity and faith. He prayed while at work. He shared what he had with the poor... (he) attended Mass in the morning, yet his work never suffered... Maria always kept a pot of stew on the fire in their humble dwelling knowing Isidore would bring home anyone who was hungry. Virtues found in the lives of Isidore and Maria— commitment to family, love for the land, service to the poor, and deep spirituality—are qualities that can still be found in rural American."
