<u>Celebrating the Liturgical Year:</u> <u>The Solemnity of the Ascension</u>

The Solemnity of the Ascension is one of the great feast of the liturgical year. It celebrates the bodily ascension of Jesus into heaven. Traditionally it was celebrated on the fortieth day after Easter as a holy day of obligation, commonly called Ascension Thursday. In 1999, the American bishops, with the approval of the Apostolic See, allowed the transfer of this holy day to the Seventh Sunday of Easter on an ecclesiastical province basis per the vote of the bishops in that province. In our diocese, the celebration of this solemnity is moved to the Sunday. The Solemnity of the Ascension ranks with the feasts of the Passion, of Easter, and Pentecost in its importance. On Thursday, take a minute to reflect with St. Augustine:

Today our Lord Jesus Christ ascended into heaven; let our hearts ascend with him. Listen to the words of the Apostle: If you have risen with Christ, set your hearts on the things that are above where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God; seek the things that are above, not the things that are on earth. For just as he remained with us even after his ascension, so we too are already in heaven with him, even though what is promised us has not yet been fulfilled in our bodies.
