<u>Celebrating the Liturgical Year:</u> Feast of the Visitation

The Gospel account of this feast occurs in Luke 1:39-56. The Blessed Virgin Mary goes in haste to visit her cousin Elizabeth, and when Mary reaches Elizabeth and greets her, the baby in Elizabeth's womb – John the Baptist – "leaped for joy," and Elizabeth recognizes Mary's role in saying, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. And why has it happened to me, that the mother of my Lord comes to me? ... blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfilment of what was spoke to her by the Lord." There are several points for reflection: Mary's desire to be with her kinswoman in need and her effort to be there despite her own pregnancy – how do we seek to provide support to others in need, even at personal cost? John the Baptist leaped at the presence of the Lord. How do we bring Christ to others that they may quicken at his presence? Both Elizabeth and Mary praise God for his action. Are our eves open to God's work? How do we respond? Do we give God praise and gratitude?
