<u>Celebrating the Saints: St. Kateri</u> Tekakwitha

On October 21, 2012. Pope Benedict XVI canonized Kateri Tekakwitha, first Native North American woman recognized as a saint. In his homily on her canonization, he said, "Kateri Tekakwitha was born in today's New York state in sixteen fifty-six to a Mohawk father and a Christian Algonquin mother who gave to her a sense of the living God. She was baptized at twenty years of age and, to escape persecution, she took refuge in Saint Francis Xavier Mission near Montreal, There she worked, faithful to the traditions of her people, although renouncing their religious convictions until her death at the age of twenty-four. Leading a simple life. Kateri remained faithful to her love for Jesus, to prayer and to daily Mass. Her greatest wish was to know and to do what pleased God. She lived a life radiant with faith and purity. Kateri impresses us by the action of grace in her life in spite of the absence of external help and by the courage of her vocation, so unusual in her culture. In her, faith and culture enrich each other! May her example help us to live where we are, loving Jesus without denying who we are. Saint Kateri, Protectress of Canada and the first native American saint, we entrust to you the renewal of the faith in the first nations and in all of North America! May God bless the first nations!" We celebrate her feast day on July 14. Pope Benedict asks that her example help us live where we are, without denying who we are. Do I allow the culture to conform me to its image, or do I strive to conform myself to the image of Christ? Do I think I could be more faithful if my situation was different or do I embrace the challenges God allows as the means to grow in holiness? Do I nurture my faith with daily prayer and regular Mass attendance? What one thing can I resolve to put into practice to deepen my faith? In the close of World Youth Day 2002, Pope Joh Paul II said, "At difficult moments in the Church's life, the pursuit of holiness becomes even more urgent. And holiness is not a question of age; it is a matter of living in the Holy Spirit, just as Kateri Tekakwitha did..."

It describes her life and shares the testimony of many who have been touched by her — including Archbishop Charles Chaput, OFM, the only Native American archbishop, and Jake Finkbonner, the boy who received the miracle that lead to her canonization. The audiobook "St. Kateri Tekakwitha, Lily of the Mohawks" is aimed at youth and present her struggles to follow Jesus in her life with her tribe and the teaching s of the Jesuit missionaries.

The Joy of the Gospel in America

Over 5 years ago, the full body of bishops in the United States called for a "National Convocation" that would "convene, challenge, and motivate Catholic leaders to embrace the full vision of what it means to be Catholic and fully engaged in the Church's mission of evangelization and to proclaim the Church's vision of the human person." This Convocation, the Convocation of Catholic Leaders: The Joy of the Gospel in America, took place July 1-4, assembling Catholic leaders in a strategic conversation, under the leadership of the bishops, on forming missionary disciples to animate the Church and to engage the culture. Inspired by Evangelii Gaudium (The Joy of the Gospel), this gathering provided an opportunity for the Church in the United States to examine today's concerns, challenges, and opportunities in the light of the Church's mission of evangelization, and be equipped to go forth, ready to engage the world with the joy of the gospel.

In Bl. Paul VI's apostolic exhortation Evangelization in the Modern World, he pointed out that every member of the Church is called to evangelize: "...the whole Church received the mission to evangelize, and the work of **each member is important** to the whole." In The Joy of the Gospel, Pope Francis wrote,"...I wish to encourage the Christian faithful to embark upon a new chapter of evangelization marked by joy... I dream of a 'missionary option,' that is, a missionary impulse capable of transforming everything..." He points to the source of the "source and inspiration" of our efforts to evangelize: "For if we have received the love which restores meaning to our lives, how can we fail to share that love with others?" This experience of Christ's love is so important that the Holy Father wrote, "I invite all Christians, everywhere, at this very moment, to a renewed personal encounter with Jesus Christ ... I ask all of you to do this unfailingly each day. No one should think that this invitation is not meant for him or her.."
