Knowing the Saints: St. Mother Teresa Last September4 of last year, **Mother Teresa** was canonized, and her feast day is **September 5.** As with Pope St. John Paul II, it is, in a sense, amazing to see the canonization of someone we could watch and learn from throughout their lives. You may have heard the saying, "Actions speak louder than words." These saints are people whom we saw in action through TV and other media, but some had the opportunity to see actually, and even meet, "in real life." People who were in their presence often mention how moved they were by that experience. In a very real way they embodied St. Paul's statement, "It is no longer I who live but Christ lives in me... (Gal. 2:20). In the homily for St. Mother Teresa's canonization, Pope Francis said, "We are thus called to translate into concrete acts that which we invoke in prayer and profess in faith. ... The Christian life, however, is not merely extending a hand in times of need. ... The task which the Lord gives us, on the contrary, is the *vocation to charity* in which each of Christ's disciples puts his or her entire life at his service, so to grow each day in love." He then noted Mother Teresa's great concern for the unborn and the poorest of the poor and remarked, "May this tireless worker of mercy help us increasingly to understand that our only criterion for action is gratuitous love, free from every ideology and all obligations, offered freely to everyone without distinction of language, culture, race or religion. Mother Teresa loved to say, "Perhaps I don't speak their language, but I can smile". Let us carry her smile in our hearts and give it to those whom we meet along our journey, especially those who suffer." In Mother Teresa's words:

People are often unreasonable and self-centered. Forgive them anyway.

If you are kind, people may accuse you of ulterior motives. Be kind anyway.

If you are honest, people may cheat you. Be honest anyway.

If you find happiness, people may be jealous. Be happy anuway.

The good you do today may be forgotten tomorrow. Do good anyway.

Give the world the best you have and it may never be enough. Give your best anyway.

For you see, in the end, it is between you and God. It was never between you and them anyway
