Solemnity of Christ the King

November 25, 2018

Celebrated on the last Sunday of the liturgical year, the Solemnity of Christ the King was instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1925 with his encyclical . . . Quas primasto respond to growing secularism. He recognized that attempting to "thrust Jesus Christ and his holy law" out of public life would result in continuing discord among people and nations. In 2018, the Church faces pressures from without and crisi from within. In addition to the challenges that Christians in a secular society must confront, the body of Christ must also tend to the wounds inflicted on the Church by priests and bishops who either committed acts of sexual abuse the selves or failed to respond to abuse with justice when they had the opportunity. The Solemnity reminds the faithful that Christ reigns as king of the entire world forever. Let us r dedicate ourselves this year to recognizing the reign of Jesus Christ and his Sacred Heart in every aspect of our lives.

Advent Begins Next Sunday!

Beginning the Church's liturgical year, Advent (from, "advenire" in Latin or "to come to") is the season encompassing the **four Sundays (and weekdays) leading up to the celebration of Christmas.** There are always four Sundays in Advent, though not necessarily four full weeks. The **liturgical color** of the season is **violet** or purple, **except on the Third Sunday of Advent, called** *Gaudete* **or Rejoice Sunday,** when optional **rose vestments may be worn**. The Gloria is not recited during Advent liturgies.
