Lent Begins This Week!



This Wednesday, March 6 is **Ash Wednesday. Mass with the distribution of ashes** will be available at **8 am and 7 pm. Ash Wednesday is a day of fasting and abstinence.** Fasting is **obligatory from age 18 until age 59.**

When fasting, a person is permitted to eat **one full meal, as well as two smaller meals** that together are not equal to a full meal.

Abstinence from meat is obligatory from **age 14 on.**
