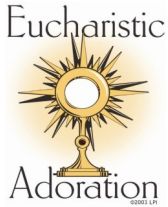
Bible Study Group

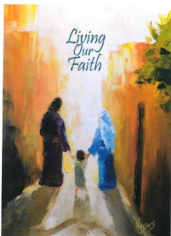
