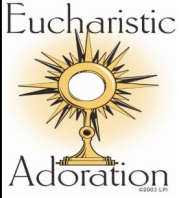
Bible Study Group

Eucharistic Adoration

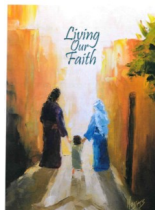

Dreamers Without Boundaries Camp

"Keeping Dreams Alive Through Soles"



My name is Peter Eke, I am a student of Eastern Oregon University and a member of the men's basketball team. This is a campaign for teenagers from the ages of 10-20. The purpose of this program is to help educate, motivate and equip teenagers around the world through sports. The program involves a shoe drive, fundraiser and a 3 days basketball camp/clinic which is planned to take place this for the second time in St. Augustine's Seminary School Ezzangbo, Ebonyi State, Nigeria. Last year, August 8-10, 2018, we had the very first of Dreamers Without Boundaries camp in Nigeria. We raised \$3,425 and collected over 150 pairs of shoes through GoFundMe, personal donations and shoe drive. Over 200 kids signed up for the camp but the funds raised was able to fully cater for 62 campers. We provided the kids with t-shirts, baskets gears (socks, shorts, practice bibs), practice equipment's (cones, basketballs, whistles) and the shoes received through the shoe drive. We were also able to feed and house the kids all through the 3 day camp period.
