## Pilgrimage Statue of Our Lady of Fatima

The Statue of Our Lady of Fatima will be in our Parish from 9:30 am Sunday, Sept. 8th until 8:30 am Monday, Sept. 9th. A complete schedule of the veneration will be published soon.



The beautiful image of Our Lady of Fatima was designed by famous sculpture Jose The-dim in 1947. Sister Lucia herself instructed him, and later remarked that she had never seen any image which so resembled the actual apparition of Our Lady.

The Bishop of Fatima entrusted the image to John Haffert, co-founder of the Blue Army, and prayed that Mary herself accompany the statue wherever it goes. It has traveled around the globe many times for nearly 70 years.

An uninterrupted flow of graces and favors have been reported wherever the statue has traveled. The purpose of the Pilgrim Virgin Statue tours was and still is to bring the graces of Fatima and Our Lady's message of hope, peace and salvation to those many millions of people who may never have an opportunity to make a pilgrimage to Fatima itself.

The Statue was blessed by Pope Francis at the Vatican ten days after he consecrated the whole world to the Immaculate Heart of Mary on October 13, 2013.
