The Five Precepts of the Catholic Church

1. You shall attend Mass on Sundays and on holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor

We must "sanctify the day commemorating the Resurrection of the Lord" (Sunday) as well as the principal feast days, known as Catholic holy days of obligation. This requires attending Mass, "and by resting from those works and activities which could impede such a sanctification of these days.

2. You shall confess your sins at least once a year. We must prepare for the Euchrist by means of the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession). This sacrament "continues Baptism's

work of conversion and forgiveness. 3. You shall receive the Sacrament of the Eucharist at least during the Easter season.

This "guarantees as a minimum the reception of the Lord's Body and Blood in connection with the Paschal feasts, the origin and center of the Christian Liturgy.

4. You shall observe the days of fasting and abstinence established by the Church.

"The fourth precept ensures the times of ascesis and penance which prepares us for the liturgical feasts and helps us acquire mastery over our instincts and freedom of heart."
