"For everyone who exalts himself shall be humbled, and he who humbles himself shall be exalted" (Gospel).

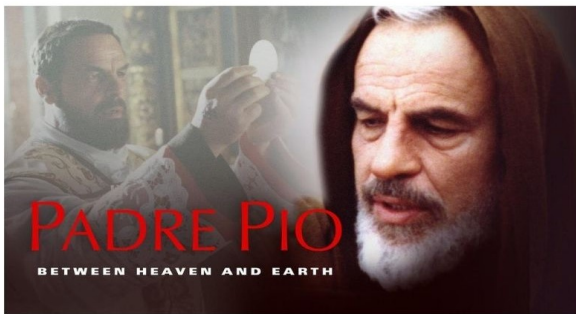
