Advent Begins Sunday, November 29th!

Beginning the Church's liturgical year, Advent (from, "ad-venire" in Latin or "to come to") is the season encompassing the **four Sundays** (and weekdays) leading up to the

celebration of Christmas. There are always four Sundays in Advent, though not

necessarily four full weeks. The **liturgical color** of the season is **violet** or purple, **except on the Third Sunday of Advent, called** *Gaudete* **or Rejoice Sunday,** when optional **rose vestments may be worn**. The Gloria is not recited during Advent liturgies.

November 22: 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time


