Saints of the Day: October 19th Saints Isaac Jogues, Jean de Brébeuf, and Companions (Memorial)

Priests, Companions, Martyrs This feast celebrates eight Jesuits-six priests and two lay associates-who gave their lives while preaching Christ to the Huron Natives of North America. Captured by the Iriquois, Isaac Jogues survived brutal tortures, including the mutilation of his fingers, before he escaped. After receiving a hero's welcome in France, he chose to return to the mission. "I would be glad if the Lord wished to complete the sacrifice where he began it," he wrote to a fellow priest. "Pray that God unite me to himself inseparably. "Jogues was tomahawked to death 1n 1646 in what today is Auriesville, New York. John de Brebeuf converted seven thousand Indians and composed a dictionary and catechism in the Huron language. He was canonized in 1930.

JOHN PAUL THE FIRST Pope Francis has approved a decree recognizing a miracle attributed to Pope John Paul I, who reigned for only 33 days in 1978. No date for his beatification has been announced. Three popes who reigned in the second half of the 20th century have been declared saints: John XXIII (1958-1963), Paul VI (1963-1978), and John Paul II (1978-2005).
