## February 14th is St. Valentine's Day

Valentine's Day is considered the most romantic day of the year, with nearly 200 million roses purchased around the world for the February 14th celebration, but, the history behind this date is actually quite grisly, involving Saint Valentine, in 269 AD.

Valentine was a priest or bishop in Rome, who lived during the third century after Christ. He was jailed by the Roman emperor Claudius II for his unwillingness to obey the emperor's orders to stop performing Christian marriages. He was also guilty of helping persecuted Christians.

According to legend, Saint Valentine wrote letters to Claudius' daughter, and miraculously rid her of blindness. He also befriended Claudius, but when he tried to convert the emperor to Christianity, he was condemned to death. Valentine wrote his final letter to the daughter of Claudius before his execution, signing it "from your valentine". He was beaten with clubs and stones, then beheaded outside the Flaminian Gate in Rome before being buried at a Christian cemetery on the Via Flaminia.

Saint Valentine is not thought to have had any intimate relationship with Claudius' daughter. The story that he signed his final letter "from your Valentine" has led to the tradition of sending and receiving anonymous cards, letters and poems from admirers.
