## OLV Scholarships Available

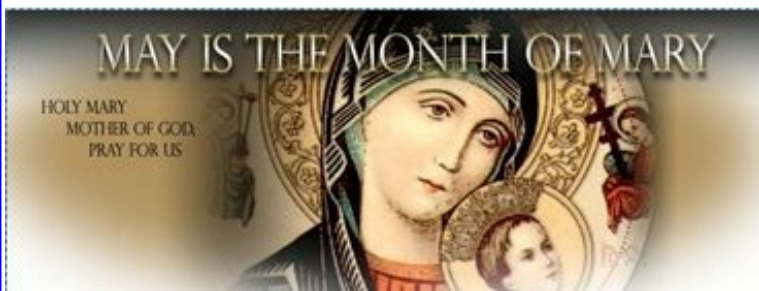
Our OLV High School Seniors will be graduating soon. Our parish has traditionally maintained a scholarship fund for our college-bound young people.
