Ordinary Time is Anything but Ordinary

Prayer involves all our senses. It involves being alive to touches of God's grace everywhere around and within us. Color in a church is more than decoration. In public worship, it has a role similar to music, art and architecture of a church — to teach, to inspire, to help gather our thoughts. If you think of the liturgical calendar as the "circle of life", the mystery of Christ unfolds. The significance and beauty of how Christ calls us to live our lives through him comes to light during Ordinary Time.

Green is used as a liturgical color during the weeks known as Ordinary Time. Generally, this period of time occurs from the end of the Christmas season until the beginning of Lent, and from the end of the Easter season until the beginning of Advent. Far from being a filler between other liturgical seasons, Ordinary Time has its own meaning, signified by its own color.

GREEN is the liturgical color of Ordinary Time that we find on priestly vestments and in our church decor. It is the color of life and hope.

The first period of Ordinary Time we have wonderful prayer opportunities with our families. This is a time of conversion, maturation, and quiet growth. It comprises the longest time on the liturgical calendar when the faithful consider the fullness of Jesus' teachings and miracles while on this earth.

The second season of Ordinary Time follows the celebration of Pentecost; the gift of the Holy Spirit moves us to do God's work. The Spirit does for us and the Church what Jesus did for His disciples — He left them with His love, fire, and Spirit to share with the world.

Tenth World Meeting of Families

The Tenth World Meeting of Families is gathering in Rome from June 22nd through the 26th.

The WMOF tradition was begun by Saint Pope John Paul II in 1994 when the United Nations declared that year as "International Year of the Family". Hence, the

1st WMOF was held that year in Rome.
Since then, every three years, in different places around the world, a World Meeting of Families has been held, together with an International Pastoral-Theological Congress. It concludes with a Festival of Families in the presence of the Pope and a great final Eucharistic Celebration.

Amidst the trials, challenges and difficulties of life today, it might "seem somewhat out of touch or inappropriate to talk about family holiness." Herein comes the importance of prayer in living the sacrament of marriage to the full. A relationship with God enables

riage to the full. A relationship with God enables Christian couples every day to rekindle the Grace they have received, and this sustains them in their daily

tasks and struggles.
