A discussion group about the Synod on Synodality will take place on Wednesday, July 6th at 6:00pm in the Conference Room for those who wish to attend.

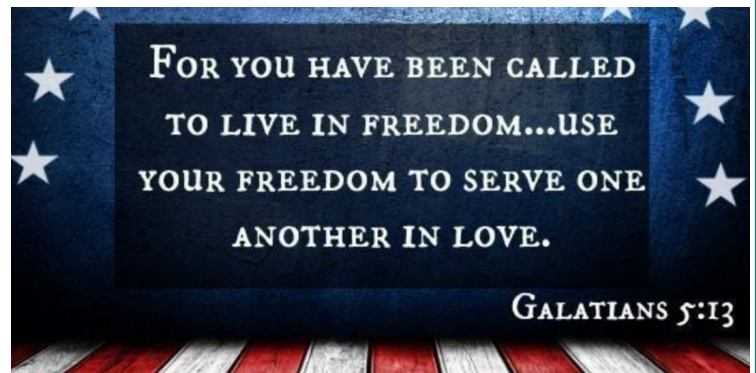

Bishop Cary's Statement on the Dobbs Decision

In 1973 seven Supreme Court Justices discovered a new and all-encompassing "right" that no previous generation had detected: the "right" to abortion. Overnight, Roe v. Wade transformed the social, legal, and moral landscape of an America instinctively rooted in Constitutional respect for the right to life. For fifty years Roe banished that respect to the periphery of national political debate.

This June 24th Roe's half-century reign came to an end.

In the Dobbs case a different Court took a very different view of this most divisive issue and set us on a course to recover national integrity: "We . . . hold that the Constitution does not confer a right to abortion. Roe . . . must be overruled . . ."

This extraordinary victory at the Supreme Court should spark even greater efforts to accompany women who bear the weight of difficult pregnancy with the compassionate care they deserve. Roe was wrong, and we now face the challenge of setting right the incalculable damage it wrought.

That is a particularly difficult challenge in our state, for in Oregon Roe still rules, its spirit entrenched in legislation and administration, its strategically well-placed supporters determined to keep the deadly status quo in place. The odds are decidedly against the pro-life cause.

So they were fifty years ago, and most of the years since. But those who resisted Roe were patiently, ever so patiently, preparing the path that led to Dobbs. They were sowing the seeds of a victory they did not live to see. It was a good seed. They left us plenty yet to sow.

in God's image and likeness, creating a community of persons who give themselves to each other eternally in love. God is a sublime artist who creates the world in love as a masterpiece of beauty and nobility. In creating man and woman in his image and likeness, he invites them to an intimate personal relationship with himself and offers them the incredible privilege of being co-creators with him.

Freedom Flows from Dignity: The Second Vatican Council does nothing but draw out the implications of this biblical witness. It bases the right to freedom of religion on human dignity. It teaches that morality can never just be imposed from without as so many rules and regulations but must be internalized in a sanctuary called conscience. It teaches that not just a select few, but all, are called to the heights of holiness, regardless of their state in life or occupation. It teaches that if all are created in God's image and likeness, then all are equal in dignity, whether man or woman, adult or child, born, or unborn, cleric or lay.

The Church reaffirms the dignity of every single human person without exception. It is also affirming our duty to stand up for that dignity. It is insisting that indeed "all men are created equal and endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights" - which means rights that no government can take away.

If you dig deeply into the meaning of the Fourth of July, you find that the entire American experiment is based on a single conviction — that there is a law that is inscribed into the very nature of the human person, a law that no government has the right to violate. Inalienable rights flow from the special dignity of human beings who are each made in the image and likeness of God.
