Sign of Salvation

Dear La Grande - Our Lady of the Valley,

In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit," we say every day as we trace on our body the sign that reveals our identity as Christians. So perfect is their "fit" that word and symbol seem made for each other; one without the other leaves us incomplete. From beginning to end Catholics are caught up in this sacramental way of life, because "the
