Christmas Nativity

A Christmas nativity is one of the most recognizable symbols of the Christmas season. The word "nativity" is from the Latin *nativus*, meaning "arisen by birth." Nativities are art, models, carvings, or live demonstrations depicting the night of Jesus' birth.

These scenes contain the Christ child in a manger; His mother, Mary; His earthly father, Joseph; shepherds; angels; various barn animals; and often three wise men. St. Francis of Assisi created the first nativity scene in 1223 to promote the true meaning of Christmas and worship of Jesus Christ. His idea caught on, and soon a new Christmas tradition was born. Today, it's almost impossible not to see a nativity scene in front of a church, in a Christmas play, someone's yard, or on a fireplace mantel. Because our sin requires a perfect sacrifice before a holy and just God, He sent his own Son to earth to become that sacrifice (John 3:16). The child who was born to Mary and laid in a manger would grow up to die on a cross and rise again so that everyone who believes in Him may receive forgiveness for sin and eternity in heaven.
