We also believe that death does not separate the living from those who have died. Just as we ask each other for prayers during our lifetime, we continue that practice even beyond death. If you do not receive Church envelopes, there are envelopes in the pews and on the small table as you enter the church, to commemorate someone on this special day through arranging a Mass for the repose of their soul.

**How to Request a Mass**

All Souls Day reminds us of the importance of having a Mass offered for the repose of the souls of our deceased loved ones.

**What does it mean to have a Mass "offered" for someone?**

Any individual may ask a priest to offer a Mass for several reasons: for example, in thanksgiving, for the intentions of another person (such as on a birthday), or, as is most common, for the repose of the soul of someone who has died.

When a person dies, the Catholic Church teaches that they face individual judgement, and whether they ultimately end up in Heaven, Purgatory or Hell will depend on how they have lived their life. ... Offering a Mass for the Dead means praying for those souls that are in Purgatory, hoping that their time there is shortened.

**To request a Mass for a deceased loved one, fill out one of the envelopes provided in the pews or on the little table as you enter the church.** Drop it in the collection basket or bring it to the Parish Office and a Mass will be scheduled as per your request and announced in the bulletin in the *Weekly Events* section.
