How do we become humble?

In one account of the life of Saint Anthony, it is said that God showed him the world full of the snares of the devil. Following the vision, the saint was filled in trepidation and said, "Lord who can escape the snares? And he heard the voice that answered, Anthony, he who is humble can escape, for God gives the grace to the humble, but the proud fall into all sorts of traps set by the devil. The devil does not dare attack the humble man.

If we truly desire to be humble we must strive to overcome the sin of pride. The greatest obstacle to becoming holy is the sin of pride. In fact, this is the first sin we can all confess when going to confession because it is the root of all sins. This root must be pulled up if we want to become humble.

In Bethlehem, there is a small door you must enter in order to be in the place of Jesus's birth. It was said that they lowered the Church door so that the Roman horses could not enter, but later it was said, that in order to see the baby Jesus you must bend down very low in order to enter the place of Jesus' birth, you must also become humble in order to enter Heaven. How do I become humble? The answer is through the grace of God. Only grace from God can give us the clear vision and the dignity that comes from humility.
